FROM THE DEAN

Dear Colleagues,

We will recognize you in a suitable way at the Annual Dinner after the Member's Recital on June 4th. And thank you, Julie, for taking on the placement position. We will be tweaking the application information that churches submit to have their position listed with the chapter, and Julie will have full oversight of that process.

I hope three or four of you will be ready to demonstrate your hymn playing skills at our next meeting, a masterclass on **Creative Hymn-playing and Improvisation** with **David Enlow**, on **Saturday February 11**, at the First Unitarian Church of Providence (1 Benevolent Street). David is Organist and Choirmaster at the Church of the Resurrection in New York City, and teaches the liturgical service playing and church music courses at the Juilliard School. He is Dean of the New York City chapter AGO, and maintains a busy schedule of recitals and workshops around the country. Do come to this event: play and/or observe, take notes, listen and learn from one of our profession's established "stars" who is an engaging teacher and a devout, dedicated church musician.

And mark your calendars now for our March 19th event, a lecture-recital on New Organ Music for the Church Year, by Christian Lane, at Grace Church, 175 Mathewson St., Providence, at 4:00 pm. The wealth of organ music written in the past 30 years or so, inspired by the themes of the church year (usually pieces based on hymn or chant tunes), and using both traditional and more modern compositional techniques, is repertoire we should all be more aware of, whatever our level of ability!

FROM THE HISTORIAN

January 26, 1942, was not a particularly historic day in RIAGO history, until now. On that date, Mary Alberta Doglio - Virtulo (then Mary Alberta Doglio) gave a concert at 8:15pm in All Saints Memorial Episcopal Church on Westminster Street. This is the only known concert that she gave for the AGO. She was organist at St. Peter RC Church in Pawtuxet village. (The building is now the Baptist Church, and St. Peter Church Parish was relocated.) Many years later, her estate has provided funds toward production of RIAGO organ concerts. In order to honor this generosity, the board is proposing a 75th anniversary reenactment concert/members' recital during 2017.

We need the help and talents of the membership to replicate this now historic event.

- "How can I help?" you say. "So glad you asked," we say! We need:
- -Copies of the music (you may have in your music library) to be made available to those who volunteer to play.
- -Organists willing to play a piece or two from the selections.

The organ is a 3 manual. Austin 1912. Specs are available from npeterlam@aol.com

We need to procure the music right away to ensure plenty of preparation time. Please check your sources and let me know of their availability asap. Also indicate your interest in playing. There will be a follow-up in the next issue of *Vox Oceana*.

YOUNG COMPOSER COMPETITION

AGO YOUNG ORGANISTS NORTH CENTRAL REGION YOUNG COMPOSERS COMPETITION

The American Guild of Organists (AGO) announces a new music competition for composers under the age of 30. Organized and sponsored by the AGO, YoungOrganists in the North Central Region, the competition for a new work for organ solo, 3–6 minutes, is open to any individual who is younger than 30 years of age as of August 31, 2017. U.S. composers need not be AGO members; composers living outside of the U.S. must be AGO members.

First prize is \$1,000; second prize is \$500; three honorable mentions will also be announced. All prize winning and honorable mention compositions will be performed at the AGO North Central Regional Convention in Iowa City, Iowa, on June 20, 2017. Submission deadline is March 10. Competition results will be announced on March 31. For complete information and application instructions, visit Agohq.org.


